This Sunday is Vocation Sunday when we pray for an increase in Vocation to the priesthood and religious life. Please pray for our families that as Catholics we remember our homes are a Holy Place. Please pray together in your homes. Put God first and come regularly to Mass and the Sacraments. Please reflect on the scriptures in order to come to know Jesus and realise the great love he has for each one of you.
