Hello and welcome to our Sunday's liturgy of the Holy Mass. It is good to see our community returning to church on Saturday evenings and Sunday mornings but I hope those of you who have not yet returned perhaps could think seriously about coming back? There is nothing that can replace our attendance at Mass to encounter our Lord in his word and receiving him in Holy Communion. I fully understand the streaming of masses were important during the height of the pandemic but with the vaccination roll-out and the dramatic decrease in infections now is the time to bring our parish family together again. Our church is safe by wearing of masks and keeping a short distance between one another unless of course you are of the same family. Our faith in our personal relationship with Jesus in the Sacraments and in prayer will keep us close to him in these difficult times.

We are half-way through the Holy Season of Lent as we prepare for the solemnity of Easter. During this period, we are asked to pray especially the family rosary to honour Mary as we meditate on the mysteries of our Lord's life. We are asked to fast one day of the week (this means to have one normal meal and two smaller meals) or something of your own choosing and good works. It is also a time to reflect on our Lord's passion and death on the cross and His Glorious Resurrection on

Easter Sunday. We have in the Narthex booklets on the Stations of the cross and on the rosary to help you.

On another matter we have a Giant Easter Egg to raffle to help our parish finances. Please help us by buying a ticket (or two) in our raffle. All you have to do is pick up an envelope, add your name telephone number and five pounds and it could be yours!

Our church is open for private prayer on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday and for Mass on Friday at 9.00 a.m. Holy Week is just around the corner and times of the Holy Week services will be on our website and in the newsletter on the table as you enter the church. Don't forget to pick up your Easter envelope for your priest even if you pay by standing orders.

Our Sunday gospel speaks of love "God so loved the world that He gave His only Son so that all who believe in Him might be saved". Perhaps we could reflect on those words as we know the world is in bad shape through sin, and the suffering of so many people; the poverty in so many countries and our slavery to sin. We can also reflect on the many families who have lost a loved one during this pandemic or effected by the after-effects from those who have recovered from this virus. St. John the apostle who spent part of his life in exile in Patmos said to his congregation - "My dear children, love one another, because this was the command of the Lord".

St. Joseph, whose feast we celebrate this week, pray for us and our parish family.
