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



"The Lord replied, "If you have faith the size of a mustard seed, you would say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it would obey you".

IN TODAY'S GOSPEL

The disciples said to the Lord, 'Increase our faith!' (v.5). Have you ever wondered what they were really asking for? What does it mean for faith to be increased? Jesus' answer implies that faith doesn't need to increase - or at least it's not a matter of having more or less faith. The power of faith seems to depend upon using the faith we have, or, we might say, of acting upon our faith.

In linking faith to the image of the mustard seed, Jesus is clearly referring to its minute size as compared with its potential fruit and therefore the power that's contained within it. While it's one of the smallest seeds, it grows into one of the largest garden plants (see Matt. 13:31-32). According to Jesus, even a small amount of faith has the potential to accomplish the staggering, nature-defying act of commanding a mulberry bush to be uprooted and transplanted in the sea, an act which could only be achieved by a person of superhuman power - or by a very ordinary person with faith in an extraordinary God.

It's in exercising our small faith in a great God that we begin to see his power at work in our world. It's interesting that, as far as we know, the apostles never actually tried uprooting mulberry trees and replanting them in the sea. However, they did learn to uproot men from Satan's kingdom and transfer them to God's kingdom through their preaching of the good news. Jesus said elsewhere that they would become fishers of men (Matt. 4:19).

The power of faith, therefore, seems to be a matter of exercising God's power to transform lives. Faith grows through being exercised, which we do by being obedient to the Master's voice, by obeying his call and his Word to us, and by humbly recognizing that, 'We are unworthy servants; we have only done our duty'. Lord, like your first disciples you've called me to be a 'fisher of men'. Help me to exercise the faith that I have, so that lives may be transformed by your great power and love and may be won from the kingdom of darkness to the kingdom of light.


Church open each day for visit to Blessed Sacrament

A big welcome to our Sunday Liturgy to our parish family, and our visitors, and to our younger parishioners. He also says 'Do not be ashamed of your testimony to the Lord nor of me, a prisoner for his sake, but bear your share of hardship for the Gospel with strength that comes from God.

The message for us is clear: in the midst of hardships, pain, suffering and approaching death we tell others to hold their faith in Jesus. Also let us be conscious of the presence of Jesus Christ given to us when we were baptised. Also recognise the power of love and self control. Finally hold fast to the truth and to live always the message of the gospel.

A message from His Eminence **Vincent Gerard Cardinal Nichols**

The subject of death is so often a taboo subject in our secular society. But in the light of our Catholic faith it is one we should have the confidence to face. The resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead on Easter Day transforms our understanding of death. Faith tells us that, through our baptism, we already share that risen life of Jesus. This is a bond that nothing - including death - can ever destroy. That is why we have the confidence to pray these words, taken from the funeral mass: In him the hope of blessed resurrection has dawned, that those saddened by the certainty of dying might be consoled by the promise of immortality to come. Indeed, for your faithful, Lord, life is changing, not ended, and, when this earthly dwelling turns to dust, an eternal dwelling is made ready for them in heaven.
