### IN TODAY'S GOSPEL

G.K. Chesterton said, "The Christian ideal has not been tried and found wanting. It has been found difficult; and left untried". It is relatively or comparatively easy to talk about or give lip service to ideals such as loving our enemy, not judging, turning the other cheek and praying for those who mistreat us - but try doing these things when you actually have someone to forgive or indeed have an enemy who wants to harm you. Then, of course, it isn't as easy, as Chesterton, prophet that he was, highlights.

So what's the solution? Do we have to try harder, pull our socks up, regroup and buckle down to living the Sermon on the Mount and the Beatitudes? For many this is the answer and their best response. The only problem - apart from being heretical - is that it misses the mark, because the Christian faith isn't about trying harder, buckling down and putting in the effort. Of course, many will claim it is - and without doubt we have to co-operate, we have to want to live Jesus' teaching, but simply trying harder isn't the answer. Because grace is the answer - grace building on our nature, so that we can live a new life in and by the power of the Holy Spirit. How does this happen?

As offensive and possibly as scandalous as this may sound, we need to be overwhelmed by our complete inability to live the Christian ethic; we need to touch our bankruptcy and feel deep down in our being a wretchedness born of an insight that we desperately need God's grace. Nevertheless, we do not need to be dismayed or overwhelmed, for the power of the Holy Spirit enables us to live holy lives, because holiness is the fruit of the Holy Spirit.

We often subscribe to the view that God helps those who help themselves, but this is a myth because God helps precisely those who cannot help themselves. The point is that when we acknowledge this, when at a deep level we recognize our need for God's grace, God's grace and mercy and his Holy Spirit are poured out into our hearts, so that we can love our enemy, we can forgive from our hearts, and we can pray for those who persecute and mistreat us.

*Lord, I am a poor sinner, but you can work the miracle of making me a little better.*

Welcome to our parishioners and visitors to our parish liturgy on the seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time.

Again thank you all very much for the recent 'get well cards' - they are so uplifting and very much appreciated.

We are two weeks away from the beginning of Lent. Now is the time to be thinking what sacrifice I can make, and bring it to the altar on Ash Wednesday to do during Lent as we

prepare for Easter.

The Lenten penance should be difficult. First we should centre it around prayer. Whatever you do ask the Holy Spirit to help you choose it out of love for Jesus whose journey we begin that leads to Easter.

In today's Gospel reading Jesus spells out what it means to honour the commandment of love. It means loving your enemies, doing good to those who hate you, blessing those who curse you and praying for those who mistreat you. It means giving to everyone who asks of you and doing to those who would have them done to you.

In other words, stop judging, stop condemning, and forgive and give.

Reflection for parents. Today is a good day to take a love inventory!

Jot down the eight practical directions given in the Gospel summary honouring the commandment of love on a scale of 1 to 5, five being living in love. Rate yourself as a parent, as a spouse, and as a follower of Jesus. Where is there room for growth and change?

First rate yourself as a family according to how you should love others. Second, rate yourselves how you show love to those outside your immediate family, for example your neighbours, friends, and other family members. Ask yourself where you are living in love and where there is room for growth and change?

Fr. Anthony has informed us that he is available to say a weekday Mass on Thursdays at 10.00 a.m.


