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

IN TODAY'S GOSPEL

The Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life. The phrase 'source and summit' is a rather awesome one, isn't it? It's as if the blessed Eucharist contains the entire spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ himself, our Passover Lamb. The great St. Irenaeus put it so beautifully when he said, 'Our way of thinking is attuned to the Eucharist, and the Eucharist in turn confirms our way of thinking.'

What does it mean to have our way of thinking attuned to the Eucharist? The word 'Eucharist' has its roots in the Greek words 'eucharistein' and 'eulogein', which recall the Jewish blessing - especially during a meal - of God's works of creation, redemption and sanctification. At the very heart, then, of the Eucharist is giving

At the very heart, then, of the Eucharist is giving thanks to God. The Eucharist is a celebration of praise and thanksgiving at which Christ is made real and present. This is why, on entering a church where the Eucharist is in the tabernacle, we recognize the presence of Christ.

We must continue to cultivate a genuine sense of Eucharistic wonder and awe. This will happen as we allow the Holy Spirit to help us grow in awareness of the fact that it's truly Christ himself whom we are receiving. This understanding that Christ is real and present in the Eucharist cannot be apprehended by the senses but only by faith, and our faith relies on God's authority, for it was Jesus himself who said, 'This is my body which is given for you' (Luke 22:19).

The eminent Church Father St. Cyril said, 'Do not doubt whether this is true, but rather receive the words of the Saviour in faith, for since He is truth, He cannot lie.' The Eucharist is our greatest gift, our richest blessing and most cherished treasure. Nothing in the Christian life compares to it for in the Eucharist is Christ himself, the 'Godhead here in hiding'.

'Godhead here in hiding, whom I do adore, masked by these bare shadows, shape and nothing more, see, Lord, at Thy service low lies here a heart, lost, all lost in wonder at the God thou art.' (St. Thomas Aquinas)

Mass attendance

Saturday 11 June: Sunday 12 June:

Welcome and hello to our parish family and to our visitors. Today we celebrate the feast of Corpus Christi. This feast was established for three purposes

- To give God collective thanks for Christ's abiding presence with us in the Eucharist and to Honour Him there;
- To instruct the people in the mystery, faith and devotion surrounding the Eucharist;
- To teach us to appreciate and make use of this great gift of the Holy Eucharist, both as Sacrament and as sacrifice.

Today's readings tell us the Eucharist is a blessing or praise of God. Also the Eucharist as a memorial of what Jesus did at the last supper, and the Eucharist is the never ending supply of bread which Jesus fed the multitude prefigured his own Body, the consecrated Bread that sustains us until he comes again. The Eucharist is also a re-enactment of Christ's sacrificial self-giving.

The Holy Eucharist is the centre and culmination of Christian life. Why? It enables us to participate In Christ's sacrifice as a present reality and to benefit from its fruits in our own lives. It helps us to worship the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit in the most perfect way. It strengthens our charity and unity with Jesus and each other in a joint offering of His Body and Blood to the Father. It gives us a lasting memorial of Christ's suffering, death and Resurrection, reminding us of our obligation to make loving sacrifice for others.

The Eucharist is the Mystery of our Faith, the Mystery of our Hope, the Mystery of our Charity. We do this because Jesus told us to do so "Do this in memory of me". Therefore we need to receive this message of unity and sacrificial love. We need to prepare properly to receive Holy Communion in a state of grace - that is, free from sin. There is always a need for repentance and a need for the Sacramental confession of grave sin before we receive Holy Communion. Let us receive Holy Communion with fervent love and respect.

St. Paul says "whoever therefore eats the Bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be answerable for the Body and Blood of the Lord". We need to be Christ's bearers by receiving Holy Communion as Mary was with the duty of bringing Christ to others.


As we celebrate this great feast, let us worship Jesus and say, as St. Augustine said - "O Sacrament most holy, O Sacrament Divine. All praise and all thanksgiving, be every



OR Codes

What are they and how do they work?


A QR (Quick Response) code works in the same way as a barcode at the supermarket. It is a machine-scannable image that can instantly be read using a Smartphone camera. Every QR code consists of a number of black squares and dots which represent certain pieces of information. In our instance, the QR code will take you directly to a website where you can make your donation digitally, instead of using cash. The Diocese is wanting ALL churches to use this form of giving to replace cash which is time consuming and expensive to count and check.

Using the QR code enables the parish to save time and money - both of which are very welcome! So please don't forget that if you normally donate cash weekly, then please use the QR codes which can be found on the back page of the newsletter each week. This helps to keep the money coming in while reducing the amount of cash that we have to count, double check and then take to the bank. And amazingly some banks have actually stopped taking cash! Thank you and God Bless.
