IN TODAY'S GOSPEL

We crossed into a new millennium 20 years ago and a new stage of the Church's journey began. At the heart of this new adventure was the new evangelization, a fresh, new and dynamic momentum to 'put out into the deep', or 'Due in Altum'.

Peter and his fellow disciples trusted Jesus' words and cast their nets, and, 'When they had done so. they caught such a large number of fish that their nets began to break'.

These words, 'put out into the deep', still ring out today, inviting us to remember the past with gratitude, live the present with enthusiasm, and look forward to the future with confidence, because. 'Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and for ever.

To 'put out into the deep' is related primarily to evangelization, of winning souls for Christ. Jesus is the goal of history and the One Saviour of the world. The Church and the Spirit cry out in unity, 'Maranatha' or 'Come. Lord Jesus'.

He is also the goal and purpose of our lives, and the litmus test of faith is always: do you know Jesus Christ our Lord? For in knowing and loving him we become strengthened in grace and desire to share this blessing with others. We are called not to be afraid but to be fishers of men and women. We are called to understand the deep desires and longings of every human heart, but to do this we must first understand our own. We thirst to know the Living God. We cry out to know his mercy and forgiveness in such a way that deep joy and happiness well up within. The Spirit is the One who quenches thirst and brings new life. This is God's merciful love which was made known in Christ. When we come to touch his goodness, kindness and compassion our hearts sing out: 'O give thanks to the

Lord for he is goodness and kindness. We are ambassadors of God's mercy, channels of his love, and witnesses of his goodness and kindness.

Lord, fill my heart with the confidence to win others over to the living love and mercy of God.



Welcome to all Our Parishioners and visitors to our Sunday Mass. Today's readings remind us that God's call is to a person and the positive response to that leads us to be a follower of Jesus. Isaiah in the first reading today and Peter in today's gospel express their unworthiness. Isaiah says 'what a wretched state I am in! I am lost, for I am a man of unclean lips and I live among a people of unclean lips, and my eyes have looked at the King, the Lord of hosts'. Peter says in the gospel when he saw the catch of fish at the Lord's command, 'Leave me Lord, I am a sinful man'.

For both these were life changing experiences. Every one of us by virtue of baptism has a special call from God to carry out a specific mission. Each person has a unique imprint to make in the world that no one else can. St. Francis de Sales said 'We all have a vocation. We believe that God has placed us in this life to fill a special need that no one else can accomplish'.

God extends his call to everyone. He trusts that we can do it. The question we ask 'do we respond positively to God's call?' The call could be to help a person in need. Maybe to forgive someone who has hurt us. Maybe to respond to a need in our parish or some social service. Maybe to pray for others especially if we have been asked. Maybe a call to the priesthood or religious life or to married or single life. Pope Francis says 'we will never discover the special, personal call if we remain enclosed in ourselves, in apathy of those who fritter away their lives in their own little world'.

In this Mass, we pray that God will enkindle in our hearts the passion to answer His call, like Mary, Isaiah, Paul and Peter and many others. A call to love, to serve, to be holy, to make a difference in our world.



Confirmation 2022

The first meeting for confirmation will be Sunday 6 February at 5.00 p.m. in the parish hall. This meeting is for both the candidates and their parents. Anyone one else who wishes to join the programme (14+), please contact Fr. Leslie prior to this date. The sacramental life of the church is important for all of us to stay close to Jesus, as we journey through life. Please pray and come forward to receive this sacrament. Confirmation is the second sacrament where you will be anointed with the fullness of the Holy Spirit and his Gifts. By this anointing the confirmed receives the 'seal' or 'mark' of the Holy Spirit. A seal is a sign of authority or ownership of the object. Christ himself declared that he was marked with his father's seal. The seal of the Holy Spirit makes our total belonging to Christ, our enrolment in his service for ever, as well as promise of divine protection. In the prayer "Send your Holy Spirit to be their helper and guide - give them the spirit of Wisdom and understanding, right judgement, courage, knowledge, reverence, spirit of wonder and Love" I ask our parents to engage in conversation about the important sacrament offered to our young teenagers for their journey in life.

QR Codes

Giftaid-it

What are they and how do they work?

A QR (Quick Response) code works in the same way as a barcode at the supermarket. It is a machine-scannable image that can instantly be read using a Smartphone camera. Every QR code consists of a number of black squares and dots which represent certain pieces of information. In our instance, the QR code will take you directly to a website where you can make your donation digitally, instead of using cash. The Diocese is wanting ALL churches to use this form of giving to replace cash which is time consuming and expensive to count and check.

Using the QR code enables the parish to save time and money - both of which are very welcome!So please don't forget that if you normally donate cash weekly, then please use the QR codes which can be found on the back page of the newsletter each week. This helps to keep the money coming in while reducing the amount of cash that we have to count, double check and then take to the bank. And amazingly some banks have actually stopped taking cash!
