IN TODAY'S GOSPEL


We stand today at the beginning of Advent and joyfully anticipate the celebration of Christmastide. Our pilgrimage invites us to revisit and partake in the events surrounding Jesus' first coming: his birth and entry into human history when the Word became flesh and dwelt among us.

Since the beginning, Advent has been a season in which we reflect on the first coming of Christ but also prepare for his second. The deepest longing of the Holy Spirit is expressed in the cry 'Come', which the Spirit gives to the Church. The prayer of both the Spirit and the Church will always be. 'Come. Lord Jesus, come.' God always has in view the end towards which the whole history of salvation is directed. Our desire to prepare for Jesus' return is proportional to our current relationship with him. His return heralds not just the coming of a kingdom, of a new order of things, but the return of the Lord of Lords, the Servant King who loved and died for us.

The call throughout the New Testament is to be active, to prepare, be watchful and be holy as God is holy, so that we can 'stand before the Son of man'. At Jesus' first coming he came to save and redeem so that we would know forgiveness and liberation from our sin. At his second coming, we will know the redemption of our bodies and the full deliverance for which the whole of creation longs.

Advent, then, is a time to grow in holiness through repentance and the forgiveness of sins. Behold, now is the acceptable time spoken of by the Spirit, the day of salvation, peace and reconciliation: the great season of Advent. This is the time eagerly awaited by the patriarchs and prophets, the time that holy Simeon rejoiced to see. This is the season that the Church has always celebrated with special solemnity. We too should always observe it with faith and love, offering praise and thanksgiving to the Father for the mercy and love he has shown us in this mystery.

Welcome to all our parishioners and visitors to our Sunday Mass in the season of Advent.

Cardinal Vincent Nichols encourages us take up the invitation of Advent and to be hopeful of a new and fresh encounter with Jesus, the Word made flesh. The season of Advent and Christmastide invites us to a fresh encounter with Jesus, the Word made flesh, God made man.

On the Sundays of Advent we shall have The Blessed Sacrament Exposed on the altar for private prayer from 5.30 p.m. till 5.55 p.m. on Saturdays. There will also be morning Mass on Tuesday Thursday and Fridays at 9.00 a.m. The Sacrament of Reconciliation is on Saturdays from 10.00 a.m. till 10.30 a.m. or before Mass on request.

This week we reflect on the parable of the prodigal Son. Firstly, in Luke’s gospel, we hear from the Son - “Father I have sinned against heaven and before you. I am no longer worthy to be called your son. Treat me as one of your hired servants”.

Secondly - “But while he was still a long way off, his father saw him and felt compassion and ran to him and embraced him and kissed him”. This week we explore returning to the Father with all our heart and humbly pray, Lord, have mercy on me.

Let us prepare for Christmas asking Our Father to grow in faith and deepen our understanding of the Sacrament of Reconciliation and of the Blessed Sacrament of the Eucharist.

May the Lord bless us all this Advent. May his Word be born afresh within us.

Journey Home (Continued)

Unite ourselves to the Eucharistic Prayer.

At the altar, the priest prays in the person of Christ, the High Priest, and on behalf of the whole church. This prayer offers thanksgiving to God for bringing everything into being and sustaining it in being. It also recalls the Last Supper and by the power of the Holy Spirit, the salvation offered once and for all by Christ becomes real and truly present to us, bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ, our Holy Communion.

The Eucharistic prayer concludes with the priest recognising that 'all glory and honour is yours forever and ever' to which everyone responds with a great 'Amen'. This is our deeply felt 'yes' to the beauty, truth and goodness of the Blessed Trinity.

Recognise your adoption as sons and daughters of God.

The proof of this is that 'God sent the spirit of his son into our Hearts, crying out, 'Abba! Father!' (Gal 4:6) The very words that Christ prayed in the Our Father are given to us so that we can reach out to our Heavenly Father and know his care and love for us.

Become the sign of peace

The sign of peace might be mistaken for a convivial sign of affection. It's not. The peace is a sacred action calling us to a profound peace and unity that we cannot manufacture but that is ultimately a gift from God. Through the Eucharist, we are grafted to Christ, the Prince of peace, and it is as peacemakers that we come to be known as children of God.

Confirmation 2022

If you wish to be confirmed next year, please give me in writing your name and contact details. You should be 14+. The preparation course begins in January 2022. Confirmation is the second sacrament where you will be anointed with the fullness of the Holy Spirit and his Gifts. By this anointing the confirmed receives to 'seal' or 'mark' of the Holy Spirit. A seal is a sign of authority or ownership of the object. Christ himself declared that he was marked with his father's seal. The seal of the Holy Spirit makes our total belonging to Christ, our enrolment in his service for ever, as well as promise of divine protection. In the prayer... "Send your Holy Spirit to be their helper and guide - give them the spirit of Wisdom and understanding, right judgement, courage, knowledge, reverence, spirit of wonder and Love".... I ask our parents to engage in conversation about the important sacrament offered to our young teenagers for their journey in life.


