REFLECTION

There is something very gentle about the Gospel this Sunday. The Resurrection has already happened. The great drama of Good Friday and Easter morning has passed. And now we find the disciples behind closed doors, still afraid, still uncertain, still not quite able to take in what has happened.

And it is precisely there that the Lord comes to them. Not when they are strong, not when they are full of faith, but when they are hesitant and unsure. He comes and stands among them and says, very simply, 'Peace be with you.'

Thomas, of course, is not there the first time. And when he hears, he struggles to believe. His reaction is not so very different from our own at times. We want something solid, something certain, something we can grasp. 'Unless I see... unless I touch... I will not believe.'

And yet, when the Lord comes again, He does not rebuke Thomas harshly. He invites him. 'Put your finger here... doubt no longer but believe.'

This Sunday has come to be known as Divine Mercy Sunday, and rightly so. Because what we see here is not simply proof of the Resurrection. We see the mercy of God at work. A mercy that is patient with our weakness, that does not turn away from our doubts, that comes back to us again and again, until our hearts are ready to believe.

Perhaps that is the quiet invitation of this day - simply to place ourselves before the Lord as we are seeking to become the people He knows we can be. To allow Him to speak His peace into whatever is closed or fearful within us.

And to hear those words spoken to us as truly as they were to the apostles: 'Peace be with you.'

Just as a practical note, there is now a new time for **confessions**. I realise Saturday mornings may not be ideal for most people, and other local parishes offer the Saturday morning slot, so I will be available for confession before the Saturday evening Mass. I would appreciate some feedback on how this might work.
