It's a record-size hamper. Let's see if we can make it a record sized fundraise to help parish finances. We can do this!





- * Please note there are plenty of space during the week for mass to be said for your intentions or deceased members of your family or for the Holy Souls in purgatory.


PLEASE NOTE: Any Mass intentions have to be in a week in advance as our newsletter is printed a week in advance.

IN TODAY'S GOSPEL

The Four Evangelists were authentic eyewitnesses and reported real, historical events involving real people with real issues and real flaws. Take John the Baptist, for example. Jesus said that he was the greatest man ever born of a woman but that even the least in the kingdom is still greater than he (v.ll). Yet in today's Gospel we see John basically doubting who Jesus is. He wasn't sure and wanted to be convinced. Some suggest that his incarceration was taking its toll.

Lack of light, lack of sleep and lack of food and water soon break even the strongest of people. Furthermore, Jesus was confounding the Jews' expectations of the Messiah. For most Jews, and to an extent even John the Baptist, his Coming was very much connected with political and economic upheaval and victory for the Jewish people over their brutal Roman oppressors.

Jesus was indeed 'the one who was to come' (cf. Ps. 118:26; Mai. 3:1). He was, however, a different kind of Messiah from the one they were expecting. He was ushering in a different kind of kingdom - not a political or economic kingdom but a spiritual one with values different from the world and its existing kingdom. The signs of the kingdom were that the blind received sight, the deaf could hear, the dead were raised, and the Gospel of life was preached and proclaimed.

Today people still ask whether he was truly the Messiah. Were the miracles real or did the disciples simply make them up? Did the resurrection actually happen? Blessed are those who remain faithful to the teaching of Christ. Blessed are those who believe although they do not see. Blessed are those who believe that Jesus of Nazareth is the Christ, the Lord's anointed, the promised Messiah.

Lord Jesus, you are the blessed hope of the Church. We pray for your return as the King of Glory, when every knee will bow in heaven and on earth.

Journey Home Threshold of Hope (Continued)

IN BRIEF: "PRAYER IS THE RAISING OF ONE'S HEART TO GOD OR THE REQUESTING OF GOOD THINGS FROM GOD."

JESUS TEACHES US HOW TO PRAY.
In Jesus "the Kingdom of God is at hand." He calls his hearers to conversion and faith, but also to watchfulness. In prayer the disciple keeps watch, attentive to Him Who Is and Him Who Comes, in memory of his first coming in the lowliness of the flesh, and in the hope of his second coming in glory. In communion with their Master, the disciples' prayer is a battle; only by keeping watch in prayer can one avoid falling into temptation. Three principal parables on prayer are transmitted to us by St. Luke.

The first, 'the importunate friend,' invites us to urgent prayer: 'Knock, and it will be opened to you.' To the one who prays like this, the heavenly Father will 'give whatever he needs,' and above all the Holy Spirit who contains all gifts.

The second, 'the importunate widow,' is centred on one of the qualities of prayer: it is necessary to pray always without ceasing and with the patience of faith. 'And yet, when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?'

The third parable, 'the Pharisee and the tax collector,' concerns the humility of the heart that prays. 'God, be merciful to me a sinner!' The church continues to make this prayer its own: Kyrie eleison!
