FR GARY

In this Sunday's Gospel we see the very beginning of Jesus' public ministry. He walks by the Sea of Galilee and calls ordinary men who are at their daily work: Simon and Andrew, James and John. They are fishermen, busy with their nets, rooted in familiar routines. And yet, when Christ speaks, everything changes. 'Follow me,' he says, 'and I will make you fishers of men.' At once, they leave what they are doing and go with him.

There is something quietly astonishing about this scene. Jesus does not seek out the powerful or the learned. He begins with working men, in an ordinary place, in the midst of ordinary life. The Kingdom of God enters the world not with noise and spectacle, but with a simple invitation.

That invitation is not confined to those first disciples. It is addressed, in different ways and at different moments, to every one of us. Christ still passes by the shores of our own lives. He still speaks, often gently, sometimes persistently, always lovingly: 'Follow me.'

For most of us, that call will not mean abandoning our homes or professions. It means allowing Christ to shape the life we already have. It means letting his light reach into our habits, our choices, our relationships. It means trusting that he knows not only who we are, but who we can become.

The fishermen left their nets. We are asked to leave whatever entangles us and keeps us from walking freely with the Lord: fear, resentment, complacency, sin. The Gospel assures us that the One who calls is also the One who gives the grace to respond.

Each Sunday, as we gather for Mass, Christ calls us again. He draws us out of the busyness of life and invites us to walk with him. If we listen with open hearts, we may find that even in the midst of our ordinary days, a new and holy adventure has begun.

May God bless you and your families this week.
