IN TODAY'S GOSPEL

Racing pundits, canny as they are, say: "Different horses, different courses". Jesus' instructions to the disciples were spoken in a different age, a different time - an age without cars, aeroplanes, mobile phones, or (and we know it's hard to imagine) emails and social media. If, therefore, we adopted an overly literal approach to today's reading, we would look pretty daft! Jesus instructed his disciples to take nothing for the journey except a staff: no bread, no money, no bag. A modern disciple would be fine without the bread and the bag: it would be being without money and credit cards that would present the real problem. They were encouraged to stay in one house as a kind of base and not move around, remaining there until the work was done. If they, or their message, were rejected they were told to "shake the dust off their feet", a familiar Middle Eastern gesture that expressed contempt for the lack of hospitality.

The gospel must be shared, witnessed to, and boldly proclaimed. We can hide from this, shirk our responsibility, or simply convince ourselves that if we are nice, kind and decent we are giving witness. However, Christian witness and evangelization of the sort that Jesus exhorted his disciples to do is of a different quality, a completely different ball game. Ask yourself this question: if building God's Church or kingdom on earth depended on you, would it ever get done? Thankfully and mercifully, it doesn't just depend on us but we are called to give witness to Christ, and sooner or later it involves sharing with others the reason for our hope, our joy and our faith.

A good life is the best sermon, for sure "preach the gospel, and if necessary use words", but let us not be ashamed of the gospel and its message of repentance and turning to Christ.

Hello and welcome to all parishioners and visitors to our Sunday Liturgy. Today is also Sea Sunday when we pray for all who work at sea in all kinds of weather. There will be a retiring collection after Mass.

It was also so good to see so many of our parish family coming back to church, in particular Dominic who is 95. Thank you to all - it gave me great joy. We hope to bring back our Altar Servers after 19 July. Thanks to Marian and Mandy who washed the Altar

Servers albs. I am always grateful for any kind of help you can offer to our parish.

The common theme in today's readings is "God's Choice". The simple points to both are the missionary nature of the church and our calling as God's messengers. In the first reading God chooses a poor farmer, Amos, to go and prophesy in the northern kingdom of Israel. In the second reading, Paul did not just stop by telling us that God chose us in Christ. Instead he went further to tell us and remind us of the reason God chose us – "To be holy and spotless and live through love in his presence".

There is a challenge in what God expects of us in our lives. The Gospel highlights the secondary purpose. Christ took time to prepare his disciples in order to help them achieve the primary purpose of God in their own lives. Finally Christ instructed them how to go about their mission. Jesus knew the influence of materialism and that souls taken captive by it will definitely lose focus of the mission. That is why he instructed his disciples against it. Abiding by the instructions of Jesus is a sure sign of fulfilling God's purpose. Sadly priests, religious and the people of God have lost focus of our mission by disobeying the instructions of Christ. We no longer pay attention to the main purpose of our mission. We need to remind ourselves that God chose us for a purpose and must strive to achieve it.

Let us daily pray to Mary for the grace to achieve Her Son's will for us and to be faithful that each day we turn to Him in prayer asking for His mercy and love. Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

May the Lord bless our families and give life to all who have died.
