## Resumption of Masses at St. Joseph the Worker

Fr. Leslie is still to decide on a firm date to re-open the church for Masses, but before he does that, we need to ask for volunteers to be stewards at the Masses. Stewards duties will include ensuring social distancing, making sure people don't rush into the church, reminding people to use the sanitiser, and managing people coming up for communion. Stewards should not be from the Covid-19 vulnerable category. As yet there are no firm directions from the government or the Diocese on exactly what will be required to re-open churches safely for Mass but we will publish the guidelines as soon as we can. In the meantime we desperately need volunteers to help us get back to safe worship.

Some churches in the Diocese, including the Cathedral itself, are now open for private prayer. St. Joseph will NOT be open for private prayer due to the problem of ensuring that Stewards are present at all times (in addition to the long list of safeguarding requirements).
