YOUR PARISH NEEDS YOU – TO REGISTER!

Our brand new website is up and running and has the same address as before (www.stjosephshutton.org) and contains all the information you need about the Parish, Mass Times, Parish Groups etc. etc. It's very easy to use and will help us become an interactive community, as well as a loving and caring one!

What we need you all to do now is visit the "Register a New Parishioner" section which you will find under "Parish". There is a form there that we'd like you ALL to complete. When you do this, it will help us build the Parish database, so that we can more easily contact you about Parish matters. One thing that Covid-19 has taught us is that we lacked the ability to easily and effectively inform you of important changes to Mass times, Covid-19 guidelines, registration for Masses etc. etc. Our new database will solve that in future, as long as everyone gets involved and competes the form online!

Don't be put off by the title of the form being "Register a New Parishioner"! We know you are an existing parishioner but we don't have the contact details that we need, as yet. All your details will remain entirely confidential in line with current GDPR legislation. And we won't divulge your details to any third parties. The data will be held securely.

And just as important – weekly collections have slowed to a trickle, which of course is understandable given the restrictions we are all living under. It would help the church and parish enormously if you could consider making your offering by standing order, either weekly or monthly. The last few months, in addition to a reduction in Masses and attendance, has seen most of us move to a cashless society and the church is no different. Cash is always good, of course, but in these troubled times, bank transfer is so much better!

If you wish to have your CHILD Baptised, please complete the form on the website www.stjosephshutton.org

Parents must be a practising Catholic, attending Mass and the Sacraments regularly. At least one God Parent must be a practising Catholic and no more than two. The Catholic God Parent must also be a practising Catholic.

CERTIFICATE OF CATHOLIC PRACTISE

The priest is being asked to do no more than certify whether or not the child comes from a practising Catholic family to the best of his knowledge and belief, in all the circumstances.

Updated Guidance For Celebration of Mass

During Mass face coverings are to be worn. Care should be taken by people in unlooping their face coverings for the reception of Holy Communion and replacing the covering afterwards. This is to prevent contamination of the covering by the hands. However, the risk is regarded as minimal providing there is no hand to hand contact between the Minister of Communion and the communicant.

The same guidance that is used for the celebration of Mass applies to all other sacraments in our churches until further notice. It is for everyone's good that a face covering is worn.

IN TODAY'S GOSPEL

How often have we said we'll do something, but haven't done it? Sometimes we might be agreeing to an activity to be polite, with no intention of actually doing it. At other times we might agree to take part in something or do something for someone with the very best of intentions and a determination to do what we say. But then events take over, things change and get in the way, and we don't complete the task. We call Jesus 'Lord' in church, but do we do his will?

The message of the parable of the Two Sons can be boiled down to the phrase "actions speak louder than words" (but words and actions would have pleased the father more). We profess our faith and say "yes" at Sunday Mass, but do we live out our faith in our daily lives? Modern Western society likes to try and remove religion and faith from affairs of state and day-to-day living. St. John Henry Newman taught that there can be no separation between what we believe and the way we live our lives. Neither of the two sons responds well to their father in today's reading. One says "no", but then has the strength of character to change his mind and do what he knows is right. The other pays lip-service to his father, but doesn't do his will. Perhaps the modern-day version of this parable would include a third child, self-conscious and ill at ease, who asks their father not to ask too loudly or publicly, embarrassed in case anyone overhears their father's request or sees them working in the vineyard.

Nobel Peace Prize-winner President Jimmy Carter said, "I have one life and one chance to make it count for something...I'm free to choose what that something is, and the something I've chosen is my faith. Now, my faith goes beyond theology and religion and requires considerable work and effort. My faith demands - this is not optional - my faith demands that I do whatever I can, wherever I am, whenever I can, for as long as I can with whatever I have to try to make a difference."

Dear Jesus, give us courage to respond to your call and challenge. Help us to make a positive contribution to society in your name. Amen.
