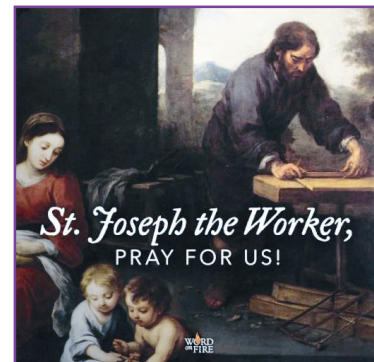

Welcome to our parish family and all our visitors to our Sunday celebration of the Most Holy Eucharist.

Marriage between a man and a woman is a fundamental part of God’s plan and this sacred act is as ancient as it is practical because without this union the human race would not exist. “be fruitful and multiply” (Gen 1:26) is the privilege of the union of a man and woman in holy matrimony.

Journey Home Threshold of Hope – Please read each week - (Continued)

Children put all their trust in their parents and unquestioningly accept what they tell them. Being needy and dependent, they receive all they have as a gift. When they know they're loved, little children will go freely and without hesitation to their parents or guardians in the assurance that their needs will be met. They don't hide their emotions, but express their love and affection easily, directly and simply. Jesus teaches us that his kingdom belongs to those who have the hearts of little children. Those who are hard of heart and full of their own importance, who put their hope in money, status and power, cannot enter the kingdom of heaven. Jesus wants each of us to come to our Father like small children, humbly, with docile and open hearts that place all our trust in the boundless and unconditional love he has for us. He wants us to recognise how very needy we are and accept as a pure gift the wonderful salvation that he purchased for us by shedding his blood on the cross. When we possess childlike trust in God our Father and have our hearts set on the kingdom of heaven, then we can allow the Lord to transform us.

Music in the Church

'It is a holy and wholesome thought to pray for our dead that they may be released from their sins' (Book of Maccabees).

Feast of Saint Bartholomew (Apostle)

Saint Bartholomew is one of the Twelve Apostles. The name (Bartholomaios) means "son of Talmai" which was an ancient Hebrew name. Besides being listed as an Apostle, he is not otherwise mentioned in the New Testament, at least not under the name Bartholomew: many ancient writers, and Catholic tradition have identified Bartholomew as Nathaniel in the Gospel of John (John 1:45-51, and 21:2). The Gospel passage read at Mass on the feast of Saint Bartholomew is precisely this passage from John (1:45-51) where Nathaniel is introduced to Jesus by his friend Phillip, and Jesus says of him "Here is a true child of Israel. There is no duplicity in him (1:47)."

Feast of the Queenship of Blessed Virgin Mary

Pope Pius XII established this feast in 1954. But the Blessed Virgin Mary's queenship has roots in Scripture. At the Annunciation, Gabriel announced that Mary's Son would receive the throne of David and rule forever. At the Visitation, Elizabeth calls Mary "mother of my Lord." As in all the mysteries of Mary's life, she is closely associated with Jesus: Her queenship is a share in Jesus' kingship. We can also recall that in the Old Testament the mother of the king has great influence in court.
