Welcome and Hello to all our parishioners and visitors. We end the Easter Season next Sunday with the Great Feast of the Holy Spirit, Pentecost. In today's Gospel, Jesus heals the paralysed man by lowering him down through the roof to avoid the large crowd which had gathered. He said "Your sins are forgiven". Jesus saw great faith in the man. The power to forgive sins is only God's prerogative. When the Pharisees heard this, they complained to Jesus. Jesus says "which is easier to say - your sins are forgiven or to say "Arise and walk". When people saw the man walking and dancing, they were astonished.

In the Our Father prayer we say "forgive our sins as we forgive others". What is sin? Sin is when you break the Ten Commandments, or break a precept, or you break a law. It is also based on relationships. When we commit sin, we are breaking our covenant with God. His loving relationship with us. We are before him who has given us everything. His love, His caring. Everything we have is His. Suddenly we betray Him with a lie, or we betray Him with doing something that goes against love. Basically, sin is a refusal to love. Sin is an act that goes against love. When we sin, everything comes to us in our selfishness, in our carelessness, in our unconcern for others. Jesus died for our sins. He died to make up for our sins by an act of love. We should constantly give heartfelt thanks to Jesus for His love and for his mercy.

Eternal God, in whom mercy is endless and the treasury of compassion inexhaustible, look kindly upon us and increase Your mercy in us, that in difficult moments we might not despair nor become despondent, but with great confidence submit ourselves to Your holy will, which is Love and Mercy itself (from the diary of St. Faustina). Have a lovely weekend with your families and a happy and holy week.

Plenary Indulgences For The Year of St. Joseph

All this Year until 8 December 2021. You have the opportunity to commit yourself with prayer and good works, to obtain with the help of St. Joseph, head of the heavenly family of Nazareth, comfort and relief from serious human and social tribulations that today affect our world. You can gain a plenary indulgence in the usual conditions i.e. sacramental confession, Holy Communion and a prayer for the Holy Fathers intention.

You can do this if you meditate for 30 minutes on the Our Father or a retreat of at least one day that includes a meditation on St. Joseph. St. Joseph invites us to rediscover the filial relationship with the Father. St. Joseph is the guardian of the Holy Family – may this inspire enthuse and encourage all families to live with the same 'intimate communion' love and prayer, by praying the Holy Rosary in families and engaged couples.

COVID Restrictions

At present if you are coming back to church, Welcome, We ask you to:

- Holy communion is given out at the end of Mass. We ask you to come up as the steward requests and leave by the door on the left. Please do not linger in the car park.

We are being asked by the Holy Father and our Bishop to pray the angelus every day for the end of the pandemic, the poor, the sick, the homeless, and the deceased.

Recited at morning, noon and in the evening. Other than during Eastertide:

V/ The Angel of the Lord declared unto Mary,
R/ And she conceived of the Holy Spirit.
V/ Behold the handmaid of the Lord,
R/ Be it done unto me according to your word.

Hail Mary.

V/ And the Word was made flesh,
R/ And dwelt among us.

Hail Mary.

V/ ray for us, O holy Mother of God,
R/ That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

Let us pray.

Pour forth, we beg you, O Lord, your grace into our hearts: that we, to whom the Incarnation of Christ your Son was made known by the message of an Angel, may his Passion and Cross be brought to the glory of his Resurrection. Through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.
