



IN THE GOSPEL TODAY

Jesus began his public ministry in Galilee, as predicted by Isaiah (see 9:1-2). Tragically, the chief priests and Pharisees, who were familiar with the Scriptures, were so stubborn, blind and resistant, and said to Nicodemus, 'Are you from Galilee, too? Look into it, and you will find that a prophet does not come out of Galilee' (John 7:52 NIV). Jesus' initial preaching began like John the Baptist's, with a simple proclamation about the need for conversion and change: 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near' (v.17). Repentance doesn't sit comfortably with us today, probably because we've lost a sense of sin and consequently have also lost a sense of the need to repent and turn back to God. We strive for a different grammar of faith, and sin, repentance, contrition and conversion are rarely mentioned. The Greek word metanoia means 'to change one's mind or change direction'. The Holy Spirit works in us to convict us of sin and lead us towards repentance; in other words, to change our minds and think differently. The Holy Spirit is the mind-changer but more importantly the heart-changer.

Repentance in this sense isn't difficult because the Holy Spirit leads us to see how destructive and dark ways of thinking harm and undermine our wellbeing and happiness. God created us with the gift of free will, which is why repentance is so vital. God assists us with grace but also respects our free will and ability to choose and decide whether to sin or not to sin, to turn back to God or to remain in our rebellion. Once we repent, once we tum back to God, once we take that first step, we open ourselves up to his healing mercy. Repentance unlocks the door to the royal road, the highway of holiness, the way of the Spirit.

Lord, thank you for the gift of repentance and for the chance to change, turn over a new leaf, and renounce ways of thinking and acting that harm me and those around me.

Ukrainian Emergency Winter Appeal

Ukrainians remain resilient despite the circumstances of the war, but they are in the throes of a harsh winter. For that reason, a new Emergency Winter Appeal was launched to provide food packages for the most vulnerable on the frontlines and in recently liberated regions in East and South Ukraine which is suffering from a severe humanitarian crisis. The cost of one food parcel, providing enough food for two people for a week costs approximately £16. Each package contains the basics (grains, flour, pasta, meat and fish preserves, oil, canned vegetables, sugar, tea coffee, biscuits, etc.).

It is hoped that £160,000 can be raised allow the supply of 10,000 food parcels to those most in need and I ask that you and your parishioners will consider supporting this Emergency Winter Appeal.

Journey Home Threshold of Hope (Continued)

IN BRIEF: "CELEBRATING THE CHURCH'S LITURGY". WHO CELEBRATES?

Liturgy is an action of the whole Christ. Those who even now celebrate it without signs are already in the heavenly liturgy, where

celebration is wholly communion and feast. THE CELEBRANTS OF THE SACRAMENTAL LITURGY

It is the whole community, the Body of Christ united with its Head, that celebrates. "Liturgical services are not private functions but are celebrations of the Church which is 'the sacrament of unity,' namely, the holy people united and organised under the authority of the bishops. Therefore, liturgical services pertain to the whole Body of the Church. They manifest it, and have effects upon it. But they touch individual members of the Church in different ways, depending on their orders, their role in the liturgical services, and their actual participation in them." For this reason, "rites which are meant to be celebrated in common, with the faithful present and actively participating, should as far as possible be celebrated in the way rather than by an individual and quasi-privately."

SYNODAL Pathway Progress

We invite you to reflect on the Synodal Pathway. Pope Francis has extended Synod on Synodality to 2024. He made this decision "in order to have a more relaxed period of discernment". He would like everyone to live it as the journey of brothers and sisters who proclaim the joy of the Gospel.

The first was the worldwide undertaking during which Catholics were encouraged to submit feedback to their local dioceses – these have now gone to Rome. The continental share discussion will be with the Synod of Bishops. The final universal phase will begin at the General Assembly of Synod of Bishops October 2023 to October 2024.

In the meantime, we need to reflect on Eucharistic revival and how we develop and some of reverence and awe in our celebration of the Eucharist and live our Catholic values in today's world.
