
**PLEASE NOTE:** Any Mass intentions have to be in a week in advance as our newsletter is printed a week in advance.

Welcome to our parish family and visitors to our parish. Do make them welcome.

I truly invite you to pray the rosary as we prepare for the Birth of our Saviour. Last Sunday we heard about the three comings of Jesus. His first coming was when God revealed Himself by taking on our humanity. He came among us in His Divine nature and in His Human nature in order to redeem us. We heard on that first Christmas Day, he came in poverty and rejected by the people. There was no room in the various inns. He was born in a stable. We have reflected 'if we do not make a home for Him in our hearts'. His second coming is now. He comes to us in the Blessed

Sacrament, the important symbol of the Catholic faith. It's the body and blood of Christ Himself which he shed for us to attain eternal life. It's our way of getting closer to Christ. Through the consecrated bread and wine, we not only remember his ultimate sacrifice but also celebrate His presence in the Eucharist.

Today we hear of the appearance of John the Baptist calling us to repentance. Here we encounter Jesus in the Sacrament of Confession. He is present in this Sacrament waiting for us to come and seek His Divine mercy of forgiveness. John the Baptist teaches us to get rid of the material thoughts and things that distanced us from Jesus who awaits our return to Him. Sin is what separates us from Jesus. It's our failure to love. We know what we should do, to be the kind of person you know that you can become, to walk with Jesus, for Jesus has come for only one purpose and it is to teach us how to love.

The call of John the Baptist was To Repent. 'A voice cries in the wilderness; Prepare a way for the Lord, make his paths straight'. This Advent, let us put aside the thoughts and actions and way of life that separates us from Jesus. Return to Him in prayer and in Good works.

# PLEASE NOTE

### IN TODAY'S GOSPEL

On the eve of the third millennium Pope John Paul II said, 'The Council, while not imitating the sternness of John the Baptist who called for repentance and conversion on the banks of the Jordan (cf. Luke 3:1-7), did show something of the Prophet of old, pointing out with fresh vigour to the men and women of today that Jesus Christ is the "Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world" (John 1:29), the Redeemer of humanity and the Lord of history' (Tertio millennia adveniente 19).

Poor John the Baptist's message is often construed as harsh, and yet the Gospel cannot be proclaimed without something of this great prophet of old: the invitation to return to God and the proclamation that Jesus is the Lamb who takes away the sin of the world. John lived and preached in the wilderness, dressed in rough clothing woven from camel hair, and ate locusts and wild honey, and yet the people still flocked to him.

We seem to have moved away from sin, repentance, confession and conversion; perhaps this isn't 'on message' anymore. But we can still acknowledge that examination of our lives, confession and repentance are crucial to living the Christian life, then as now.

Advent is a penitential season, a time to be reconciled with God and one another. We're invited to make a sacramental confession at least once a year, but many of us haven't been for years. God's hand of mercy and compassion is extended to everyone. Remember, we're not confessing our sins to the priest but rather laying down our burden before God. If a priest has received faculties to hear confession (and this isn't automatically granted by the bishop) we hope and pray that he has the necessary pastoral wisdom and maturity to minister this sacred grace so that we can know in a deeply personal way the mercy, forgiveness and compassion of God.

'Have mercy on me, O God, according to your steadfast love... Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity. Cleanse me from my sin.' (Ps. 51:1-2)

# **SYNODAL Pathway Progress**

We invite you to reflect on the Synodal Pathway. Pope Francis has extended Synod on Synodality to 2024. He made this decision "in order to have a more relaxed period of discernment". He would like everyone to live it as the journey of brothers and sisters who proclaim the joy of the Gospel.

The first was the worldwide undertaking during which Catholics were encouraged to submit feedback to their local dioceses - these have now gone to Rome. The continental share discussion will be with the Synod of Bishops. The final universal phase will begin at the General Assembly of Synod of Bishops October 2023 to October 2024.

In the meantime, we need to reflect on Eucharistic revival and how we develop and some of reverence and awe in our celebration of the Eucharist and live our Catholic values in today's world.

# Jesus teaches us how to pray

Just as Jesus prays to the Father and gives thanks before receiving his gifts, so he teaches us filial boldness; "Whatever you ask in prayer, believe that you receive it, and you will." Such is the power of prayer and of faith that does not doubt; "all things are possible to him who believes." Jesus is as saddened by the "lack of faith" of his own neighbours and the "little faith" of his own disciples as he is struck with admiration at the great faith of the Roman centurion and the Canaanite woman.

The prayer of faith consists not only in saying "Lord, Lord," but in disposing the heart to do the will of the Father. Jesus calls his disciples to bring into their prayer this concern for cooperating with the divine plan.


