THIRTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (A)

Hello everyone I hope you are all well. Keep safe when you begin to move around again.

In today's Gospel, Jesus summarises both the costs of discipleship and its rewards. Jesus said to his apostles "whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me, and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me; and whoever does not take up his cross and follow after me is not worthy of me.

Whoever finds life will lose it, and whoever loses his life for my sake will find it. Whoever receives you, receives me; whoever receives me receives the one who sent me. Whoever gives a cup of cold water to one of these little ones to drink will surely not lose his reward".

The gospel may seem hard. Yet they underline for us a truth - choosing anything with one's whole heart has consequences. Choosing life with Christ means every relationship we have must be understood from a new perspective. Today's gospel also highlights for us the importance of hospitality in the Christian life. To welcome another in Jesus' name is to extend hospitality to Jesus himself. We have many opportunities in our daily life to reach out to others, to be a welcoming presence and a sign of God's love.
